REGULAR MEETING

DELAWARE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

MARCH 14, 2007

The regular meeting of the Delaware County Board of Supervisors was held Wednesday, March 14, 2007 at 1:00 P.M. in the Supervisors' Room of the Senator Charles D. Cook County Office Building, 111 Main Street, Delhi, New York, Chairman James E. Eisel, Sr. presiding.

The Clerk called the roll and all Supervisors were present except Mr. Rowe and Mr. Ryan.

Chairman Eisel advised that Mr. Rowe is attending a FEMA meeting and Mr. Ryan is out of town.

Mr. Donnelly offered the invocation.

Mr. Marshfield led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Chairman Eisel welcomed back Daily Star news reporter Patsy Breakey, who has been recovering from knee surgery. He also commented on the good health of Mr. Bert More who was injured last fall in an auto accident.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as presented.

The Clerk reported all communications received have been referred to their respective committees for review.

Chairman Eisel referenced the request made by Executive Director of Soil and Water Conservation District Richard Weidenbach to contact our legislatures and inform them of the county's need for additional funding to cover the 25 percent match needed for United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service funding. He advised that he prepared letters to Governor Elliot Spitzer, Senator John Bonacic, Assemblyman Clifford Crouch and Assemblyman Peter Lopez requesting flood recovery assistance. The letters were passed around for each Board member's signature.

Chairman Eisel granted privilege of the floor to Commissioner of Watershed Affairs Dean Frazier.

Commissioner Frazier referenced the packet placed on each Supervisors' desk containing several copies of the Delaware County Action Plan (DCAP) Program summary and asked the Supervisors to place the summaries in their town hall for the public.

In response to Mr. Valente, Director of Economic Development Glen Nealis provided a brief update on the Empire Zone.

Mr. Nealis said that ten businesses, Amphenol, Tyco Healthcare, Unadilla Silo Company, Van Cott Development, Sportsfield Specialties, Inc., Huff Ice Cream, Groff & Hoyt Enterprises Inc., Price Chopper, Ace Hardware and Arnan Development Corp. have been certified locally and are currently in the process of being approved by the State after a thorough review by the Department of Labor. The proposed investments from these businesses over the next ten years is \$500 million and the creation of approximately 280 new jobs. In total, the investments and benefits from the empire zone to the county will be approximately \$26 million dollars over the next ten years.

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Planning Department and the Delaware County Department of Public Works has the expertise and will partner with individual towns to develop these plans; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation has amended our contract to accept this funding identified as "Highway Management Plans for the Towns Phase II of Delaware County".

The resolution was seconded by Mr. Bachler.

In reply to Mr. Marshfield, Director of Planning Nicole Franzese stated that eventually all the towns in the watershed will benefit from this program, but they are currently trying to get four towns done. She commented that much of the data with regard to this program was lost due to flooding.

In response to Mr. Homovich, Commissioner of Public Works Wayne Reynolds explained that all the resources that the towns have such as, signs, guide rails, culverts and small structures of less than a twenty foot span will be inventoried and then ranked as far as condition. When completed, the inventory will provide the towns a complete assessment of its infrastructure.

Mr. Homovich suggested the county ask the State to double the CHIPS funding and use that share to fix the culverts and stormwater. The CHIPS program is based on road mileage.

Commissioner Reynolds pointed out that having a complete picture of the town's infrastructure could be used as an arguing document for funding. Through the assistance of Ms. Franzese and Commissioner Frazier the county received over \$1.2 million in core money. The money was used to repair damaged culverts which have a direct impact on water quality.

In response to Mr. Marshfield, Commissioner Reynolds explained that there needs to be a strong commitment on the part of the towns to keep these inventory plans updated. The departments of Planning and Watershed Affairs have done a good job of educating the town highway superintendents on the value of the plan. He said the plans are GIS based and every culvert has been located with GPS so there is an actual location for each culvert with a picture attached to it.

Mr. Marshfield questioned what was required of the selected town during this data collection. Commissioner Reynolds said only their cooperation and recognition that DPW will have crews on their roads at various times. The data collected from the crews is combined with information received directly from the town to provide a complete inventory.

Chairman Eisel questioned if this type of assessment would indirectly cause a problem for the towns in the event of a disaster. Commissioner Reynolds replied that he didn't think so. Mr. Meredith said that the town of Walton had this inventory before the flood and it actually helped.

Chairman Eisel mentioned that he remembered a discussion that indicated the age and condition of the bridges were going to affect the amount of money that would be received. Commissioner Reynolds said that has never come to pass. He felt that having the inventory would be helpful.
