#### **REGULAR MEETING**

#### **DELAWARE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**

#### **JULY 18, 2007**

The regular meeting of the Delaware County Board of Supervisors was held Wednesday, July 18, 2007 at 7:00 P.M. in the Supervisors' Room of the Senator Charles D. Cook County Office Building, 111 Main Street, Delhi, New York, Chairman James E. Eisel, Sr. presiding.

The Clerk called the roll and all Supervisors were present.

Mr. Donnelly offered the invocation.

Mr. Maddalone led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as presented.

The Clerk read a letter received from Governor Elliot Spitzer sent in reply to Chairman Eisel's letter thanking the Governor for coming to the town of Colchester immediately after the June 19<sup>th</sup> flash flood. The Governor stated in his letter "that visiting the devastation helped to confirm the gravity of the emergency...that the people of Delaware County can feel confident in the dedication and strength of character that is so clearly evident in its Board of Supervisors."

The Clerk reported that all other communications received have been referred to their respective committees for review.

Chairman Eisel granted privilege of the floor to Mr. Utter. Mr. Utter stated that Resolution No. 211-05, the Board of Supervisors dedicated the Co-Composting Facility to former Town of Bovina Supervisor Charles LaFever and now a plaque is being presented in Mr. LaFever's memory by Conporec/S&W Services Inc. He introduced Jeffrey Heath a member of the Joint Venture and Vice President and Program Manager of Conporec/S&W Services Inc. as well as Mr. LaFever's son Raymond and daughter Susan Hughes.

Mr. Heath remarked that he has not met anyone, even to this day, with as much conviction as Mr. LaFever to do something with solid waste other than landfill. Mr. LaFever was the Chairman of the Public Works Committee and under his direction the county developed a long term effective solid waste program. Mr. Heath honored the memory of Mr. LaFever with a plaque that reads "for his leadership, dedication and commitment to Delaware County Solid Waste goals and practices." The plaque will be hung in the Solid Waste Management Facility and will be a reminder for future generations of the dedication and commitment of Mr. LaFever. Raymond LaFever, on behalf of himself and his family thanked, the members of the Joint Venture and the Board of Supervisors for recognizing the contributions of his father. He expressed the pride his family had for the work his father did as a public servant. He said his father had a very practical theory on garbage, "we make the garbage we need to do something about it ourselves."

Chairman Eisel commented that Mr. LaFever worked long and hard to put this composting facility together. He felt the plaque was a very appropriate gesture.

Town of Colchester Supervisor Robert Homovich, speaking for himself, the Town of Colchester Board and the residents of Colchester thanked the many people, agencies and elected officials that came to their aid following the June 19<sup>th</sup> flash flood event. He said it is a sad situation made tolerable through the help of others. There was loss of lives due to the flood which gave no warning. The National Weather Service will be doing a study on the cause.

Chairman Eisel granted privilege of the floor to Mr. Utter. Mr. Utter said that it made him very proud to be part of a department that within twenty-four hours after the disaster made Cat Hollow passable. He thanked everyone involved for their efforts throughout the disaster. He introduced Commissioner of Public Works Wayne Reynolds who provided a powerpoint presentation of photographs depicting the devastation in the town of Colchester as a result of flash flooding on June 19<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Reynolds explained that on June 19<sup>th</sup> the area along the Delaware and Sullivan County border received six to eight inches of torrential rain in a matter of hours. The significant rain fall caused severe flooding, described by some as three waves of water that came with tremendous force creating major damage on the Delaware County side to a six mile stretch of County Route 7, also known as Route 206. The flooding caused the destruction of one bridge and damage to several others, homes were washed away, and lives were lost.

Commissioner Reynolds noted the magnitude of this disaster was like no other experienced. The financial cost of the damage sustained to Cat Hollow is estimated to be between \$8 to \$12 million dollars. He pointed out that the area had no wireless communication capability from June 19<sup>th</sup> through July 1<sup>st</sup> until a temporary cell tower was placed in the area. Commissioner Reynolds complimented the immediate response of Emergency Services, county employees and outside contractors.

In conclusion, Commissioner Reynolds offered special thanks to all the employees that worked so diligently throughout the week and weekend. He thanked the Public Works Committee and the Board of Supervisors for their willingness to support the department. He said without the equipment DPW has, the department could not have responded to this emergency as they did.

Mr. Maddalone commented that the county is fortunate to have the leadership of

Commissioner Reynolds.

Mr. Rowe commented that following the flood he and his co-workers were assigned by the State Department of Transportation to work on Cat Hollow. It was a proud moment for him when he arrived with his co-workers at Cat Hollow the first day and saw all the county equipment, noting that the county equipment is the envy of the state.

Chairman Eisel thanked Commissioner Reynolds for his commitment and dedication to the county. Commissioner Reynolds pointed out that he did not work alone and extended his thanks to his staff and crew.

In response to Mr. Meredith, Commissioner Reynolds stated that the Department of Environmental Conservation could not issue the required certification because the original design when completed by the contractor did not meet the action leakage rate. It appeared that there was a leak.

Commissioner Reynolds explained, at the expense of the contractor, an exhaustive search was conducted in an attempt to find the leak, however, none was found. A DPW engineer concluded that the failure must be caused by a wicking action that wicks the water up around the anchor trench for the primary liner. The only way to solve this type of problem would be to go

ahead with the next phase of Cell 6 which would not have been constructed for another four or five years. As a result of this failure, the county gained another acre of landfill space.

Commissioner Reynolds said that since the completion of the next phase of Cell 6 the problem has been corrected and the required certification has been received.

### TITLE: AUTHORITY TO ACQUIRE RIGHT OF WAY FOR BRIDGE RECONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

WHEREAS, BR 151, George Road over Dry Brook in the town of Middletown, was damaged during the flood of April 2005; and

WHEREAS, failure of the bridge would result in a home being inaccessible; and

**WHEREAS,** the county has spent a considerable sum developing plans for the reconstruction; and

**WHEREAS,** FEMA funding for the design and construction of the project has been approved; and

**WHEREAS,** the Delaware County Board of Supervisors passed Resolution No. 134, dated May 23, 2007, that authorized the Department of Public Works to make award of this work to Delaney Construction pending the acquisition of the necessary right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, a permanent easement is necessary to allow construction to proceed; and

**WHEREAS,** the county has been unable to acquire the necessary easement as provided for under Section 118 of the Highway Law; and

**WHEREAS**, said action would be de minimis pursuant to Section 206 (D) of the Eminent Domain Procedure Law

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the County Attorney is herewith authorized to proceed with the acquisition of the necessary temporary construction easement in accordance with the eminent domain procedure law.

The resolution was seconded by Mr. Woodford.

Mr. Utter commented the owner is very environmentally minded and is an avid fisherman who purchased a strip along the stream giving him control of the stream. He declined to settle for the \$100,000 financial compensation offered for abandonment of the bridge as he does not want to have the bridge moved upstream. Unfortunately, using eminent domain is the only option left in dealing with this situation.

SECTION 1. Section 4-A of Resolution No.144, enacted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware on June 13, 1990, imposing sales and compensating use taxes, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4-A. Imposition of additional rate of sales and compensating use taxes.

Pursuant to the authority of section 1210 of the Tax Law, in addition to the sales and compensating use taxes imposed by sections 2 and 4 of this resolution, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an additional one percent rate of such sales and compensating use taxes, for the period beginning December 1, 2003, and ending November 30, 2009. Such additional taxes shall be identical to the taxes imposed by such sections 2 and 4 and shall be administered and collected in the same manner as such taxes. All of the provisions of this resolution relating or applicable to the administration and collection of the taxes imposed by such sections 2 and 4 shall apply to the additional taxes imposed by this section, including the applicable transitional provisions, limitations, special provisions, exemptions, exclusions, refunds and credits as are set forth in this resolution, with the same force and effect as if those provisions had been incorporated in full into this section and had expressly referred to the additional taxes imposed by this section.

SECTION 2. Paragraph (C) of subdivision (1) of section 11 of Resolution No. 144, enacted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Delaware on June 13, 1990, imposing sales

and use taxes, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

(C) With respect to the additional tax of one percent imposed for the period beginning December 1, 2003, and ending November 30, 2009, in respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in this county prior to December 1, 2003.

SECTION 3. This enactment shall take effect December 1, 2007.

### TITLE: IN SUPPORT OF STATE FUNDING FOR BELLEAYRE MOUNTAIN SKI CENTER

WHEREAS, promotion of the tourism industry is of critical importance to the economy of Delaware County; and

**WHEREAS,** the Belleavre Mountain Ski Center plays a critical role in that tourism economy by attracting more than 200,000 visitors a year to the region; and

WHEREAS, dozens of studies by public, private and government agencies over the last 50 years have identified Belleayre Mountain as an economic lynchpin of the entire Catskill Mountain region; and

**WHEREAS,** the Belleavre Mountain Ski Center creates employment for more than 1,000 people each year; and

WHEREAS, Belleayre Mountain provides a four season recreation facility for visitors from throughout the Northeast which directly benefits many local motels, restaurants, gift shops and other tourism related businesses which rely heavily upon the visitor traffic created by the ski center and affiliated events; and

WHEREAS, the voters of the State of New York approved a constitutional amendment in 1987 authorizing an expansion of the state owned ski center which, to date, has not been fully realized; and

WHEREAS, investment of public funding in economic development is the legitimate business of State government because all residents of the State benefit from economic development initiatives; and

WHEREAS, other ski centers in the region were developed more than a decade after Belleayre Mountain opened because Belleayre served as an economic catalyst for the development of the Catskill Mountain skiing industry: and

**WHEREAS,** Belleavre Mountain must receive continued reinvestment if it is to continue to serve as an economic catalyst for the region.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Delaware County Board of Supervisors urges ongoing investment in Belleayre Mountain to expand it to the full size and scope authorized by New York State voters in 1987; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor

Eliot Spitzer, the New York State Comptroller's Office, Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno, Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, Senator John J. Bonacic, Assemblymen Clifford W. Crouch and Peter Lopez, and the New York State Association of Counties.
