The regular meeting of the Delaware County Board of Supervisors was held Wednesday, July 28, 2010 at 5:30 p.m. in the Supervisors' Room of the Senator Charles D. Cook County Office Building, 111 Main Street, Delhi, New York, Chairman James E. Eisel, Sr. presiding.

The Clerk called the roll and all Supervisors were present except Mr. Valente and Mr. DuMond.

- Mr. Marshfield offered the invocation.
- Mr. Donnelly led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as presented.

The Clerk reported all communications received have been referred to their respective committees for review.

Mr. Utter offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

In answer to Mr. Dolph, Commissioner of Social Services William Moon stated that for the purpose of this transportation study the New York State transportation run programs could not be utilized.

Chairman Eisel noted that he and Vice Chairman Tina Molé are members of the Project Steering Committee. The State Department of Transportation previously provided grant funding in the amount of \$50,000 which was awarded in Resolution No. 170 passed in October 2009. This resolution is for an additional \$30,000 which will allow RLS Associates, Inc. to complete the transportation study and bring the county to implementation by late fall or early next year. The Project Steering Committee has been meeting regularly and is in agreement that there is a better way of providing transportation. The committee is in the process of discussing the benefits of obtaining a mobility manager to coordinate all of the transportation needs. For example, the mobility manager, may coordinate with providers to arrange appointments in such a way as to allow for the transport of several clients to the same provider. He advised the Board that the Project Steering Committee will eventually bring a proposal back to the Board for approval.

Mr. Marshfield commented that he is anxious to see the outcome of this program. Where a public transportation system would be too costly for Delaware County to consider, this transportation program appears to be a viable tempered plan that has the potential of accomplishing something worthwhile.

Chairman Eisel agreed, the county is large and rural making a public transportation program difficult and costly. The transportation study will find better ways of using our existing resources and he believed that a mobility manager would create a program that could work for us.

**WHEREAS,** the New York State Police will provide funding and construction of an 80 foot extendable to 140 foot public safety communications tower to be located on the site of the Delaware County Public Safety Building; and

**WHEREAS,** Delaware County will construct an appropriate foundation and excavate the site in preparation for tower construction; and

**WHEREAS,** Delaware County Public Safety organizations have determined the necessity of the tower to provide communications with the existing public safety tower at Mount Utsayantha to be used by the County Sheriff, local fire and emergency service organizations and the Emergency Management Office; and

**WHEREAS**, the New York State Police and local law enforcement offices will be better served as a result by providing the necessary link between the Sidney and Delhi dispatch offices;

**WHEREAS**, the Delaware County Board of Supervisors has determined the construction of the tower must comply with 6 NYCRR Part 617 State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) as a Type 1 action under 617.4 (7) and a coordinated review is required

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Delaware County Board of Supervisors declares themselves lead agency for the construction of the extendable public safety communications tower and will coordinate the environmental review with all other involved agencies.

# TITLE: AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH MUNICIPALITIES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, DISTRICT CORPORATIONS OR STATE AGENCIES FOR SHARED HIGHWAY SERVICES DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

**WHEREAS,** all municipalities, including the County of Delaware have the power and authority to contract for the purpose of renting, leasing, exchanging, borrowing or maintaining of machinery and equipment, with or without operators, with other municipalities; and

**WHEREAS,** all municipalities, including the County of Delaware, have the power and authority to borrow or lend materials and supplies to other municipalities; and

**WHEREAS**, it is hereby determined that the County of Delaware and other municipalities have machinery and equipment which is not used during certain periods; and

**WHEREAS**, it is determined that the County of Delaware and other municipalities often have materials and supplies on hand which are not immediately needed; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby determined that by renting, borrowing, exchanging, leasing or maintaining highway machinery and equipment and the borrowing or lending of materials and supplies, the County of Delaware and other municipalities may avoid the necessity of purchasing certain needed highway machinery and equipment and the purchasing of or storing a large inventory of certain extra materials and supplies, thereby saving the taxpayers money; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized and determined, from a practical working arrangement, that no program of borrowing, exchanging, leasing, renting or maintaining of highway machinery and equipment or borrowing or lending of materials can be successful if each individual arrangement has to receive prior approval by the county Board and the governing board of each of the other municipalities which may be parties to such agreements, since such agreements must often be made on short notice and at times when governing bodies are not in session; and

**WHEREAS**, it is incumbent upon each municipality to design a simple method whereby materials and supplies, equipment and machinery, including the operators thereof, may be obtained or maintained with a minimum of paperwork and inconvenience and with a swift approval process; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Delaware County Board of Supervisors to authorize the Commissioner of Public Works to enter into renting, exchanging, borrowing, lending or maintaining arrangements with the persons serving in similar capacities in other municipalities without the necessity of obtaining approval of the County board prior to the making of each individual arrangement; and

WHEREAS, a standard contract has been prepared which is expected to be adopted and placed into effect in other municipalities, and will grant the person holding the position comparable to that of the Commissioner of Public Works authority to make similar arrangements; and

**WHEREAS**, it is hereby determined that it will be in the best interest of the County of Delaware to be a party to such shared services arrangements.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Chairman of the Board is hereby authorized to sign contracts with municipalities, School Districts, District Corporations or State agencies for Shared Highway Services.

In answer to Mr. McCarthy, Director of Planning Nicole Franzese explained that Agricultural Districts are a provision in the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets (Ag & Markets) law. Inclusion in an agricultural district provides a farmer with the

support of the Ag & Markets if a situation warrants such intervention.

Ms. Franzese answered in reply to Mr. McCarthy, if someone is removed from an agricultural district it is usually because they no longer qualify or did not respond to the survey requests that are sent out in order to determine qualification in the district.

In answer to Chairman Eisel, Ms. Franzese stated that being in an agricultural district does not afford an automatic tax deduction.

**WHEREAS,** the Delaware County Board of Supervisors must hold a Public Hearing to consider the requests and recommendations of the County Agricultural Farmland Protection Board concerning the inclusion of land(s) into Agricultural Districts No. 1.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Delaware County Board of Supervisors does hereby schedule a Public Hearing for Wednesday, August 25, 2010 at 5:15 p.m. in the Board of Supervisors Room of the County Office Building, 111 Main Street, Delhi, N.Y.

The resolution was seconded by Ms. Molé.

Chairman Eisel noted that the Public Hearing will be held Wednesday, August 25<sup>th</sup> at 5:15 p.m. prior to the Board of Supervisors meeting.

**WHEREAS**, the department would like to appropriate the necessary funding directly for this project.

Mr. Utter explained that seven bids were received ranging from the lowest of \$418,000 to the highest of \$600,000. The bid opening was held this afternoon at 3:00 p.m. Upon review of the bid, a mathematical error was found. In case the company has to back out, this appropriation would cover the difference between the lowest bidder and the second lowest bid that would then have to be accepted. The lowest bidder has three days to withdraw the bid.

In answer to Mr. Marshfield, Mr. Utter said the low bidder has experience with this type of work and would do a good job for the county. The question is whether the contractor can do the job for the bid amount submitted.

In answer to Mr. Marshfield, Commissioner Reynolds stated if FEMA does not come through with the funding, the money would come from the county's reserve.
