REGULAR MEETING

DELAWARE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

OCTOBER 13, 2021

The regular meeting of the Delaware County Board of Supervisors was held Wednesday, October 13, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. in the Supervisors' Room of the Senator Charles D. Cook County Office Building, 111 Main Street, Delhi, New York, Chairman Tina B. Molé presiding.

The Clerk called the roll and all Supervisors were present except Mr. Davis and Supervisor for the Town of Sidney. Mrs. Scott attended via Zoom.

- Mr. Marshfield offered the invocation.
- Mr. Cetta led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as presented.

The Clerk noted that all communications received have been referred to their respective committees for review.

Mr. Gladstone offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 148

TITLE: 2021 BUDGET AMENDMENT ACCEPT EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PERFORMANCE GRANT (EMPG) DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY SERVICES

WHEREAS, Delaware County has been awarded grant funding under the FY 2021 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) State Homeland Security Program from the NYS Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services for a contract period of 10/01/2020 - 09/30/2023; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the EMPG Program is to make grants to states to assist state, local, and tribal governments in preparing for all hazards, as authorized by the *Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act* (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the *Stafford Act* authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the federal government, states, and their political subdivisions. The federal government, through the EMPG Program, provides necessary direction, coordination, and guidance, and provides necessary assistance, as authorized in this title so that a comprehensive emergency preparedness system exists for all hazards; and

WHEREAS, this grant was awarded in the amount of \$22,516.00 to Delaware County and shall be used to purchase interoperable communications equipment as well as information technology equipment.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Department of Emergency Services be authorized to accept this grant funding as described above and that the 2021 Budget be amended as follows:

WHEREAS, New York State Department of Health is providing additional grant funding from January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024 to promote and increase COVID-19 vaccinations; and

WHEREAS, Delaware County Public Health Services will implement vaccine confidence strategies, conduct local COVID-19 vaccine promotion campaigns and operate COVID-19 clinics to increase the number of individuals who receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

TITLE: 2021 BUDGET AMENDMENT ACCEPTANCE OF GRANT FUNDING FOR TAI CHI FOR ARTHRITIS PROJECT OFFICE FOR THE AGING

WHEREAS, the Office for the Aging has been granted \$5,000.00 from Delaware County Rural Health Alliance to expand the agency's existing Tai Chi for Arthritis program for the County's older population; and

WHEREAS, this funding will be used to engage in activities to support health promotion and stay healthy wellness programs.

RESOLUTION NO. 151

TITLE: CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 PROP 27-21 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 93 of 2021 authorized the award of Proposal No. 27-21, "Rehabilitation of Knox Avenue Bridge over Wilson Hollow Brook (Bridge NY 2018) BIN 3352080, PIN 9754.77" to ING Civil, 11 Arch Street, Watervliet, NY 12189-1805 for the bid amount of \$848,224.00; and

WHEREAS, Item 619.100101 - INTERIM PAVEMENT MARKINGS, STRIPES (TRAFFIC PAINT) needed to be increased by 1,871 linear feet or \$3,742.00 to match the

quantity used in the field; and

WHEREAS, an equivalent amount of \$3,742.00 shall be deducted from the available funds of Item 697.03000BM - Field Change resulting in a net zero dollar change in the overall contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Department of Public Works is herewith authorized to execute Change Order No. 1 for Proposal No. 27-21 resulting in a net zero change in the contract.

RESOLUTION NO. 152

TITLE: DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS POLICY ON SNOW PLOWING HOURS

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works (DPW) is responsible for keeping County roads free of ice and snow during the winter season; and

WHEREAS, due to budget and other constraints it is not feasible to keep the roads passable on a twenty-four-hour basis; and

WHEREAS, experience has proven that in order to plow and apply deicing and/or abrasive materials prior to school buses traveling County roads, the trucks need to be ready to start winter maintenance between the hours of 4:00 and 5:00 a.m. as necessary; and

WHEREAS, it has been the policy of DPW to continue plowing and applying abrasives to the roads when necessary until 8:00 p.m.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the general winter maintenance hours for the Delaware County Department of Public Works are herewith set to begin between 4:00 and 5:00 a.m. and continue until 8:00 p.m., as necessary in the opinion of the responsible road foreman; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when contacted by the Delaware County Emergency Dispatch Center, DPW will call out the appropriate snow plow crew outside of the general hours in the event of an emergency such as an accident or fire where the emergency response personnel are on scene and requesting service.

The resolution was seconded by Mr. Cetta.

In reply to Mr. Eisel, Mr. Haynes stated the policy is the same as what they had.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Haynes offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 153

TITLE: AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWN OF MASONVILLE FOR USE OF HIGHWAY GARAGE

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works Sidney Center Patrol Garage was razed in 2014 to make way for the County Route 35 tributary to Willow Brook relocation project; and

WHEREAS, the Department is attempting to utilize shared services with the towns to prevent the need to construct a replacement shop for the Sidney Center Patrol; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Masonville has agreed to work with the County in the form of renting a bay in the Town Garage to reduce the response time for a County Snowplow plowing some of the roads covered by the Sidney Center Patrol for the winter months; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements between the parties hereto, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. The term of this agreement shall be for a one year term commencing November 1, 2021 and ending February 29, 2022. If necessary the agreement can be extended through the end of April, the County will inform the Town by February 19, 2021 if they wish to extend through March and by March 25, 2022 if they wish to extend through April.
- 2. The Town shall provide a bay, use of the bathroom facilities, an electrical outlet to plug in a time clock, two parking spaces for the employees reporting to the shop, one parking space for a County pickup and use of the telephone for County business only.
- 3. The Town will invoice the County for \$3,600 on the 1st of each month.
- 4. The County will ensure that all invoices are paid promptly and that the employees assigned to report to Masonville understand the terms of the contract.
- 5. The Town will allow the County to store a limited amount of salt and abrasives in the Town's sand and salt storage building.
- 6. The Town will also allow the County to use the Town owned loader to load the County truck.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Board is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Town of Masonville for the use of the Highway Garage.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 269 of 1990 prohibited County employees from holding more than one County position simultaneously except if such dual employment is specifically authorized by resolution of the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Office for the Aging and Veterans Service Agency are experiencing difficulties in recruiting part-time bus drivers, for example, to serve as drivers on a regularly needed basis to serve the elderly and medically needy; and

WHEREAS, from time to time employees in other county departments may be willing to work on a per-hour, as-needed basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Resolution No. 269 of 1990 is hereby temporarily waived until December 31, 2022 for County employees who are willing to work on a per-hour, as-needed basis for the Office for the Aging and the Veterans Service Agency.
