2019 Corporate Compliance Report	 Kyra reviewed the 2019 annual corporate compliance report. Agency wide training was completed in October and November. Monitored providers in Kchecks was cleaned up from 1700 to 200 monitored names. Early Intervention was revieweded in the end of 2018 and Corrective Action Plan (CAP) was accepted in July 2019. Complaints received regarding therapy providers. Early Intervention has stopped using a provider as result of complaints. Preschool complaint resulted in a desk review of a few providers. One provider's documentation was found insufficient and provider has entered into a 6-month probationary period with greater more frequent reviews of her documentation.
