Approval of Minutes	The September 22, 2022 were reviewed and approved as written.	
Public Health Program Update	We are noting some new Rabies program trends where animals are being rehomed and exchanged via social media sites instead of reputable breeders and or rescue operations. Often times the full truth regarding the rehomed animal is not provided to the new family and they find out that they cannot handle to needs and behaviors of the animal. When this leads to a bite report the follow-up becomes more complicated for our staff and local DCO (Dog Control Officer) as owners do not always have the history of the animal. Betty inquired if a countywide animal control officer would help. Mandy stated that we have advocated for a countywide Animal Control Officer as it would be beneficial for our office as town DCO's do not handle cats and some towns are having difficulty finding a DCO, which is a requirement. Many times, town DCOs are individuals that take this position on in addition to their full-time job, it is more work than they anticipated and find themselves in situations that they need more support for some of these more involved situations. We recently held two successful Monkeypox clinics.

Intervention	Council (LEICC) is comprised of leaders administering the program, local stakeholders and	
	parents. We welcomed new participants to the meeting, including some school district	
	representatives. Members listened to a presentation on transition from the EI program to the	
	Preschool program which is a multi-step complicated process. Our SLP and OT positions remain vacant which continue to leave a gap in services. There are	
	currently 5 children waiting for services. There are several children waiting for initial	
	evaluations that require these families to travel out of county for evaluation as no providers are	
	offering these in home at this time and there are no evaluators physically located in Delaware	
	County. NYSDOH BEI is planning a campaign attempt to attract more therapy and service
