TITLE: AUTHORIZING THE CREATION OF A TRAFFIC DIVERSION PROGRAM DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

WHEREAS, the Delaware County District Attorney requests to establish a voluntary Traffic Diversion Program to serve an important public safety interest, by educating motorists charged with traffic infractions, rather than prosecuting them; and
